Message from CEO

As we reflect on 2025, I am filled with gratitude and pride for what our community has accomplished together. This past year marked a historic milestone for Cancer Support Community San Francisco Bay Area (CSC SF Bay Area), as **we reached more individuals and families than at any point in our 35-year history**. Our programs expanded both in depth and breadth, with a record increase in participation and engagement. Notably, our reach became more reflective of the diverse communities we serve, including 16% Asian, 8% Latino, and 9% African American/Black participants—an important step forward in advancing equitable access to supportive cancer care.

Our impact was recognized across the region and beyond. We were honored by the **Golden State Warriors Community Foundation and Kaiser Permanente during Breast Cancer Awareness Night**, and named the **2025 Nonprofit of the Year by California State Senator Tim Grayson**.

We also continued to respond to the growing financial challenges faced by those impacted by cancer. Our **Emergency Financial Assistance Program expanded significantly**, providing direct funds to low-income patients and their families to help ease the burden of non-medical expenses during treatment.

2025 marked a transformational step towards advancing our long term mission! Through a successful \$25M campaign, **we began construction on our new, one-of-a-kind cancer support center on generously donated property**. Designed as a healing, nature-based environment, this state-of-the-art facility will expand access to supportive cancer care through in-person services, enhanced virtual, hybrid, and on-demand programming, and dedicated outdoor spaces for wellness activities. Once completed, it will significantly increase our capacity to deliver culturally responsive, evidence-informed, and accessible support that meets the evolving needs of our growing community.

None of this would be possible without you—our donors, partners, volunteers, and advocates. Your commitment ensures that no one faces cancer alone.

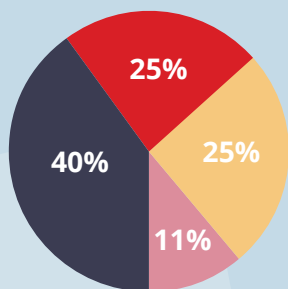

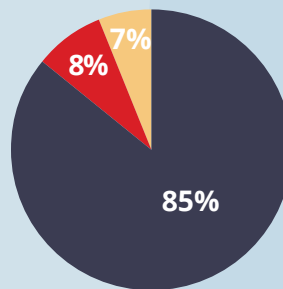

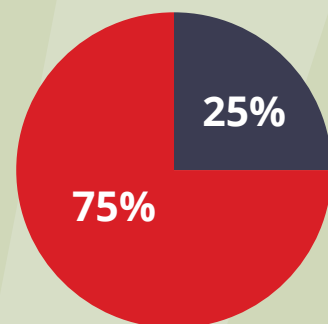
